

GRAVELANZA PARIS, 2026 EDITION - PARTICIPATION RULES AND GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE

ARTICLE 1: THE ORGANIZER The organizers of the race titled "GRAVELANZA" are SAS PLAYGROUND, a simplified joint-stock company with a capital of €5,000, headquartered at 37 rue de Domremy - 75013 PARIS, registered at the Paris Trade and Companies Register under number 827 641 184, as well as the company SALOMON.

ARTICLE 2: THE EVENT The 2026 edition of GRAVELANZA PARIS will take place on Saturday, June 13, and Sunday, June 14, 2026. The event is open to men and women, subject to the age conditions specified in Article 4. It is a gravel running race offering three courses of 7 km, 16 km, and 24 km, open to all, timed, and leading to a ranking. Qualifications on a 2 km course will be organized subject to performance conditions.

The course is entirely secured. Medical safety is provided throughout the event. These Rules apply to the 2026 edition of GRAVELANZA PARIS. In the context of these Rules, the term "the Event" refers to the "GRAVELANZA PARIS" race. The schedule (locations and dates, registration fees) will be published on the website www.paris.gravelanza.com and on the relevant social media networks. SALOMON holds all rights attached to the "GRAVELANZA" brand for French territory (including overseas territories) in all fields, including all intellectual property rights.

GRAVELANZA PARIS is identified by strong values such as eco-responsibility, social responsibility, social impact, and legacy.

ARTICLE 3: DECLARATION In accordance with Article R331-6 of the Sports Code, the Organizer submits a request for authorization to organize the event to the competent public authorities within the required deadlines. The Organizer undertakes to possess all necessary authorizations on the day of the race.

ARTICLE 4: CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION This event is open to everyone. Minors must be accompanied by an adult or provide parental authorization and a liability waiver (to be completed during the registration form). The Organizer declines all responsibility regarding the liability of minors and/or any injury that may occur during this event.

- **The Run Club & Crew Battle (2.7 km, 35m D+):** Open to persons over 16 years old (during the sporting year), i.e., born before August 31, 2010.
- **The Explorer race (7.4 km, 101m D+):** Open to persons over 16 years old (during the sporting year), i.e., born before August 31, 2010.
- **The Challenge race (16.4 km, 200m D+):** Open to persons over 18 years old (during the

sporting year), i.e., born before August 31, 2008.

- **The Endurance race (24.2 km, 292m D+):** Open to persons over 20 years old (during the sporting year), i.e., born before August 31, 2006.

Since May 7, 2021, minor athletes are exempt from providing a medical certificate provided they supply a declaration stating they have answered "no" to all questions in the health questionnaire. Any registration not meeting these criteria will be rejected and non-refundable. In accordance with French Athletics Federation (FFA) regulations, participants must provide a Health Prevention Pass (PPS) certificate issued by the FFA or a valid FFA, FSCF, FSGT, or UFOLEP license (which must mention "athletics").

BIB PICK-UP The bib will be issued upon presentation of mandatory documents:

- ID document;
- Bib collection card;
- PPS certificate (if not entered during registration).

TRANSFER OF BIBS All registrations are personal, firm, and final. No refunds will be made for any reason. The bib is strictly personal. Anyone transferring their bib to a third party will be held responsible in the event of an accident occurring to or caused by that third party during the race. The organization declines all responsibility in such situations. A participant may, however, transfer their bib to a third party using the registration transfer tool on the Njuko platform. These transfers are free of charge, and the organizer will not issue a refund. It is up to the seller and buyer to agree on the buy-back price.

RACE LOGISTICS Runners will gather at the start site. Practical info will be sent a few days before the event. Liquid and/or solid aid stations are provided on the course and at the finish. Followers, bikes, rollers, strollers, and pets (even on a leash) are prohibited for safety reasons. The bib must be worn visibly and be entirely legible during the race.

ARTICLE 5: MANDATORY EQUIPMENT

- Visible bib at all times;
- Headphones and headsets are tolerated but a low volume is advised to remain aware of surroundings.
- **Recommended:** 7km (1 flask); 16km (1 flask + 1L water bag); 24km (1 flask + 1.5L water bag).

ARTICLE 6: REGISTRATION Registration implies the

express and unreserved acceptance of these rules.

FEES (excluding management fees):

- **7 KM (Explorer):** €22 until April 27; €25 until May 15; €29 until June 13.
- **16 KM (Challenge):** €46 until April 27; €53 until May 15; €60 until June 13.
- **24 KM (Endurance):** €67 until April 27; €75 until May 15; €88 until June 13.
- **PACK 7 + 16:** €60 / €70 / €80.
- **PACK 7 + 24:** €80 / €90 / €110.

Registration is only confirmed once payment is made, rules are accepted, and documents are validated. No bibs will be distributed on Sunday, June 14, 2026.

ARTICLE 7: ACCESS TO THE EVENT SITE Illegal or dangerous objects (drugs, weapons, explosives, etc.) are strictly prohibited. Security personnel are authorized to search persons and bags. Access may be refused in case of non-compliance or disruptive behavior.

ARTICLE 8: RUN CLUB & CREW BATTLE A collective challenge for clubs and crews. Format: specific team events, such as team time trials. Criteria for trophies include sports performance, collective participation, and community engagement. Unsportsmanlike or dangerous behavior may lead to disqualification.

ARTICLE 9: RANKINGS AND AWARDS Two times will be recorded: official time (gun time) and net time (chip time). **KOM/QOM Challenge:** Rewards the best uphill performance based on specific segments. Awards are presented at the finish village for top 3 men/women overall and KOM/QOM winners.

ARTICLE 10: DISQUALIFICATION AND CUT-OFF TIMES

- **7 km:** 1h15
- **16 km:** 3h00
- **24 km:** 4h30 Beyond these times, runners are considered "out of race" and continue under their own responsibility. Disqualification may also occur for littering outside aid stations or medical unfitness.

ARTICLE 11: LIABILITY AND INSURANCE The organizers hold civil liability insurance. Participants are strongly advised to have personal injury insurance. Each participant assumes full responsibility for risks inherent to the race (accidents, weather, traffic). An optional individual cancellation insurance is offered via a third-party provider during registration.

ARTICLE 12: SAFETY A medical assistance service is provided. The organization reserves the right to remove any participant judged medically unfit to continue.

ARTICLE 13: IMAGE RIGHTS Participants authorize the Organizer to use their name, image, and voice for promotional and marketing purposes worldwide and on

any media.

ARTICLE 14: RIGHT OF WITHDRAWAL In accordance with the Consumer Code, registration for the Event is not refundable as it is a leisure activity with a pre-determined date.

ARTICLE 15: PARTICIPANT OBLIGATIONS Participants must respect the course markings, staff instructions, and traffic laws. **Code of Conduct:** Respect others, the environment (no littering), and be responsible for personal belongings (the organizer is not liable for theft/loss). Participants assume all risks (trips, falls, weather, wild animals/insects).

ARTICLE 16: MODIFICATION - CANCELLATION The Organizer reserves the right to modify the course, distance, or schedule. If the event is canceled for reasons beyond the Organizer's control, no refund is guaranteed, though compensation or deferral may be offered at the Organizer's discretion.

ARTICLE 17: PRIVACY POLICY Personal data is processed in accordance with GDPR. Data is used for order management and communication. Participants have the right to access, rectify, or delete their data by emailing contact.paris@gravelanza.com.

ARTICLE 18: RESPECT FOR THE ENVIRONMENT AND BIODIVERSITY The course crosses the Meudon State Forest (managed by the ONF). It is strictly forbidden to leave marked paths, litter, or disturb wildlife. Any breach may lead to immediate disqualification. No single-use plastics will be provided at aid stations.

ARTICLE 19: WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY By registering, the participant voluntarily assumes all risks of injury or loss and waives any claim against the Administrators. Registration online has the same legal effect as a handwritten signature. Participation is prohibited if this waiver is not accepted.
